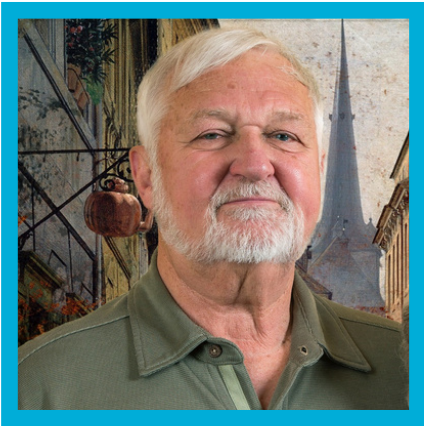

DR. JAY DAVIS



Jay Davis is a nuclear physicist, BA and MA UT-Austin, PhD UW-Madison.
